

MEMBERS ONLY: BEHIND-THE-SCENES OF THE 2014 APPLE ISLAND DIG

GWBHS is leading the effort to secure Michigan State Historic Site and National Register of Historic Places designations for Apple Island. In 2013, GWBHS received a \$10,000 project grant from The St. Francis Foundation of Michigan to fund archaeological work that will help secure these designations. An archaeological dig was conducted in summer 2013 by nationally known archaeologist, Dr. David Brose, Western Michigan University's Dr. LouAnn Wurst and her anthropology students. In 2014, a grant renewal will support a July WMU dig project and the submission of applications for the historic designations.


