APPLE ISLAND TOURS

Saturday, May 16, 11-5 p.m. and Sunday, May 17, 11-5 p.m. \$15 adults, \$10 children 5-12, \$5 GWBHS and Time Travelers members

Take a pontoon boat ride to Apple Island for a docent-led island group tour. Then, at your own pace, experience storytelling and traditional arts with Native American reenactors and 2013-2014 archaeological dig findings with Western Michigan University's Dr. LouAnn Wurst.

New for 2015! Visit with members of the group Surveying Michigan. This year is the 200th anniversary of the marking of the initial points of meridian and baseline in the state.

Tickets also include free admission to the museum, presenters and hands-on activities, including an archaeological dig experience, outdoor games and crafts.

Tours begin at Orchard Lake Museum with first come, first served in person signup beginning at 11 a.m. No phone reservations. The last tour group leaves the museum at 3:30 p.m. Allow 2.5-3 hours round trip. There are 15 steps to climb to access the island. Wear walking shoes and dress appropriately for the cooler

temperatures at the lake.

History Highlight: The Life of Louie Jane Lawton

Louie Jane Lawton, a longtime community activist, environmentalist, history-buff & lawyer in West Bloomfield passed away January 4.

Lawton grew-up and lived nearly all of her 92 years in a cottage on Green Lake with her older sister Bessie Weatherston (who died in 2004). As children, Lawton and her sister made great use of Green Lake. During summer, they swam and fished in it. During winter, they skated and windsailed on it. As adults, they fought to protect it from loud motor boats, destructive algae blooms, and other forms of pollution (Green Lake is still a quiet lake).

Lawton, who never married, became a lawyer in the 1950's, after graduating at the top of her class from the Detroit College of Law. She and her sister, a math teacher and accountant, spent years working at Lawton-Ouellette, the family insurance agency their father started. They later worked for Weatherston's son, Colt, at his architecture firm.

In 2006, the sisters were honored by the Friends of West Bloomfield Parks and Recreation with a nature interpretive sign in the West Bloomfield Woods Nature Preserve. "Both the West Bloomfield Woods Nature Preserve and Trail Network were slated for development," the sign states. "The Lawton sisters became part of a larger team to help West Bloomfield Parks and Recreation acquire both parks." (Also, Marshbank Park and the Orchard Lake Nature Sanctuary) The sign talks about the sisters' persistence and commitment: "Commitment to community and the environment was a way of life for the Lawton sisters. Both helped establish and nurture the Greater West Bloomfield

Historical Society. Their historic cottage once belonged to the early automobile mogul Walter Flanders. They worked especially hard to preserve other Flanders buildings on Green Lake and to transform the old Orchard Lake City Hall into the Historical Museum."




The Underground Railroad Michigan Connection
