Resolution of Objection to the Renaming of Green School

Adopted by the Board of the Greater West Bloomfield Historical Society at the September 7, 2011 board meeting.

WHEREAS the Greater West Bloomfield Historical Society recognizes the contributions of the Hartwell Green family as early settlers and founders of Green School, one of the first schoolhouses in West Bloomfield Township, where children could receive an education; and

WHEREAS Hartwell Green and his wife, Mary Annett, whose father purchased a half-section of land in West Bloomfield in 1824, established themselves as hard-working, successful farmers on their own property, growing more than 11 different varieties of apples and other crops; and

WHEREAS Hartwell and Mary Green, described as progressive and public-spirited, donated land and built a 20 by 34-foot log cabin schoolhouse on the corner of their property at Savoie and Green Road in 1866 and hired, paid the salary, and provided room and board for the teachers; and

WHEREAS a 150-pound bell, one of three used to call 70 children enrolled at Green School in 1870 and now on display at the Orchard Lake Museum; and

WHEREAS to honor the significant contributions of the Greens, the 80-year-old Green School name was retained to identify two additional schools, a four-classroom structure that housed K-6 built in 1948, then the present Green School constructed in 1956, both located on Walnut Lake Road;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Greater West Bloomfield Historical Society strongly objects to the June 2011 decision of the West Bloomfield School Board to erase the name "Green School," resulting in the distinct historical contribution of the Hartwell and Mary Green family to be discounted and forgotten.

The Renaming of Green Elementary School

Recently I was interviewed by a writer from *The Detroit News* regarding the renaming of Green Elementary School, part of the West Bloomfield School District. At the conclusion of the interview the writer asked why this issue should be so important. I could tell that to her my answer was not very convincing. It was not until I was preparing a speech to the Bloomfield Rotary Club that I could put the issue in context.

The Bloomfield Rotary speech coincided with the fifth day of Patriot Week – a commemoration that "renews America's spirit by celebrating the First Principles, Founding Fathers and other Patriots, vital documents and speeches, and flags that make America the greatest nation in world history." Each day of Patriot Week focuses on one of the first principles of the American Tradition. The fifth day celebrates Equality of Race and the suggested materials include the Gettysburg Address.

Abraham Lincoln was asked to visit the Gettysburg battlefield and say a few words to help dedicate the battle that had occurred there several months earlier. President Lincoln understood that he and his contemporaries could not dedicate that battlefield. Those that fought there had already done that. It was the closing comments of his now famous address that expressed his point, "It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced."

I have found myself drawn to a battle – albeit not of the magnitude of the American Civil War but a battle just the same. In June, the majority of the West Bloomfield District School Board members decided to discard the Green Elementary School name after more than 100 years. The sacrifices of one of the Township's founding pioneer families were removed from the school that they had personally donated, built and funded – a name that the District had transferred as new buildings were constructed to service increasing student enrollments. In their exuberance to surprise a retiring principal, the board renamed the school, feeling it was not necessary to consult the community, the Green family or the historical society.

Now I find myself on the field of this battle and realize that it is for us the living to be dedicated to the unfinished work of the Green Family and all the other Township pioneers who so nobly advanced the culture of this community. It is for this reason the Greater West Bloomfield Historical Society unanimously passed a resolution in protest of this name change. Personally, I will continue the battle until the Green name is returned to the elementary school on Walnut Lake Road.


