

Unveiling of 'Our School History' Informational Panels Scheduled for March

A major milestone for *Our School History* will be reached in March, with the unveiling of school history informational panels that will be displayed in all of the school buildings of West Bloomfield School District. A special event to unveil the panels will take place at West Bloomfield Township Library on March 30, 2016 (more information below).

Our School History is an ongoing project of GWBHS to document the history of area schools. In 2011, the Board of West Bloomfield School District requested that GWBHS gather information in order to help it better understand the individual histories of the schools in the district. Formerly known as *Call of the Peal of the Bell*, the project has required countless hours of work from a team of dedicated volunteers.

Some of the results of the project so far include the online publishing of school history reports and outreach to gather information from the community. Increased interest in school history has led to the mounting of historic school bells at Scotch and Roosevelt Elementaries.





'Our School History' Highlights

The *Our School History* project began with research and community outreach with the goal to create as complete an archive as possible of the history of West Bloomfield School District. The informational panels will be unveiled at the event on March 30, but here is a preview of some of the highlights.




From *Our School History*: In 1866, Hartwell Green donated a portion of his land on Green Road and Savoi Trail for a one-room schoolhouse, complete with a bell. The classroom measured 20' by 34.' One teacher taught all eight grades. The students ranged in age from five to eighteen years old. (pictured: Green School, 1920)



Scotch School, 1951


From the Eccentric, 1970: An old farmhouse on Orchard Lake Road at Green Road is going down to make way for the new West Bloomfield High School. Meanwhile Eccentric photographer Barbara Peters captured the rustic air of the place, the weathered old beams in the barn among other scenes. The West Bloomfield Board of Education offered the wood for sale and received a high bid of \$311 from Kenneth Estes of Holly, Mich.



From Wilma Webb's *This I Remember:* By 1920, the school was bursting at the seams and it was decided to build a new school on Cass Lake Road. It was named the Roosevelt School. I believe they opened the doors in September of 1920, with only one grade per room. During 1920 and 1921 there were only eight grades. In 1922 they added the ninth and each year after, they added another grade. The first graduating class was in 1925.
