Local Historian to Discuss Interurban at April Library Event

For 30 years at the beginning of the 20th century, the Detroit United Railway (DUR) operated an interurban electric railroad across the Detroit area. Farmington historian Brian Golden will discuss the interurban and its route from Farmington to Pontiac, which began at Grand River and followed Orchard Lake Road to the north.

Brian is very active in many historical groups in Farmington and Oakland County. He is the author of 5 local history books and conducts historical tours in Farmington.

If none is found, what will happen? It may be time to consider other possibilities. We hope during this time, interested members and friends of GWBHS can explore, formulate, and implement plans

for a more sustainable GWBHS structure and future.

Board members are hosting an exploratory meeting with facilitator Brian Golden at the West Bloomfield Library Main Meeting Room, January 21, 2017, 10 a.m. - noon. Brian led three very worthwhile Strategic Planning meetings in the summer of 2015. At this meeting, we hope to create a study committee and plan. (Historical Society of Michigan is providing a list of groups, similar to GWBHS, who have evolved their structure over the years).

The public appreciates the local history we share through gwb-hs.org, events, open houses, Apple Island Tours, and group programs.

What might sustain GWBHS as volunteer availability shifts? We hope you will attend this meeting to share ideas and/or consider how you might support a study effort.


GWBHS Launches Restaurant Fundraiser Program



Apple Island - An Enduring Gift



Ward Family on Apple Island

In 1915, Willis C. Ward purchased Apple Island from the Campbell family. He built a large home, complete with electricity from a generating system installed on the island.

After Willis Ward's death in 1943, his children Marjorie and Harold inherited his properties in Orchard Lake. Harold Ward donated the land that would eventually become Orchard Lake Nature Sanctuary to Cranbrook in 1969.

Marjorie's Gift

Marjorie Ward Strong was a lifelong resident of Orchard Lake. After her death in 1970, her husband General Frederick Smith Strong, Jr. donated Apple Island to West Bloomfield School District as the Marjorie Ward Strong Woodland Sanctuary. In accordance with Marjorie's wishes, the land was to be used as an educational nature center for students.
