Community Celebrates Orchard Lake Museum Reopening

After an 18 month closure that began with the COVID-19 pandemic, GWBHS recently celebrated the reopening of Orchard Lake Museum with two celebrations and 150 guests! A Grand Preview on September 10 was held for the business and civic community, and a Grand Reopening Open House on Sunday, September 12 welcomed GWBHS members and the public.

The museum features all new gallery exhibits, walking visitors through our local history with professionally printed panels, exciting new artifacts, various sensory experiences, and new perspectives on old favorites. All new outdoor exhibit panels highlight 11 outdoor exhibits.

The museum project began in January 2020 and grew in scope during the pandemic.

"We were able to more carefully update the museum and

rethink exhibits, said GWBHS President Gina Gregory. "We've included more stories

and more artifacts. Exhibits connect to the community today with artifact loans and items donated by many municipalities and organizations. A lot of thought and energy has gone into this project so that the museum will have something for everyone. It's the product of community collaboration and it has really been a labor

of love."

"Our interactive exhibits help bring history to life," said board member Carol Fink. "We now have more interactive activities with a "two-seat" Keego theater, animal furs, and a trolley coin change machine. Outdoor exhibits include a demonstration water pump and the doctor's carriage is great for photo ops."

Sylvan Lake - 100 Years and Glowing

This August 26 event in Sylvan Lake celebrated 100 years since it was founded as a Village in 1921. (It became City of Sylvan Lake in 1947.) The afternoon celebration began with skits about the Interurban Railway by Brian Golden and the Sylvan Lake Inn by Helen Jane Peters. Gina Gregory, GWBHS President, gave remarks recounting Helen Jane's contributions to the preservation of local history. Mike McGuinness, Executive Director of Oakland County Pioneer and Historical Society, presented items to GWBHS

There were historical exhibits, activities for children, vintage postcards with "secret send offs" to friends/loved ones, food trucks, a beverage tent, music, photo op, and memorabilia shirts and hats emblazoned with "SYL 100."

Keynote remarks were given by City Manager John Martin, followed by remarks by several past and present council members. A team of volunteers with John Martin announced an upcoming book to depict this homespun community on the lake with many pictures of its long and loving heritage. The volunteers then honored Helen Jane Peters, the Sylvan Lake Historian, with her very own street sign "Helen Jane Way."

The event concluded with a performance by the 32-member Motor City Brass Band, with John Martin singing.
